British Censuses & Valuation Rolls

1841 census (6 June 1841)

- Scottish census images only available on ScotlandsPeople website, transcriptions available on other websites
- findmypast can search by address for all censuses (omit building numbers)
- Name of each household member, gender, age (see below), address, occupation
- Age "at last birthday" for up to age 15, above 15 rounded down to nearest 5 years
- Whether or not individual was **born in county** in which they were living on 6 June 1841 (Yes or No)
- If born out of the country (E = England, F = Foreign, I = Ireland, S = Scotland)

1851 census (30 March 1851)

- Scottish census images only available on ScotlandsPeople website, transcriptions available elsewhere
- Name of each household member, as well as their gender, age (at last birthday), relationship to head of household
- Condition (marital status), occupation
- Place of birth (parish and county), "Blind, deaf or idiot"

1861 census (7 April 1861)

As for 1851

1871 census (2 April 1871)

• As for 1851 except also whether a person was considered "imbecile, idiot or lunatic"

1881 census (3 April 1881)

- As for 1871
- ScotlandsPeople website also offers an LDS transcription of 1881 census

1891 census (5 April 1891)

- As for 1871
- Number of rooms (if less than 5) that family occupied
- Was the person an **employer or employee**

1901 census (31 March 1901)

• As for 1891

1911 census (2 April 1911)

- Name of each household member and their relationship to head of household
- Age at last birthday, gender
- Marital condition and for women the completed years of the present marriage, number of children born alive, number of children still living, number of children who have died
- Occupation including the industry or service of work, whether an employer, worker or working on own account and also whether or not working at home
- Place of birth (parish and county) of everyone in household
- Nationality of every person born in a foreign country
- Whether a person was "totally deaf, deaf and dumb, totally blind, lunatic, imbecile, or feeble-minded"
- English forms are copies of the original, with the handwriting of head of household
- Scottish 1911 census (transcriptions & images) only available on ScotlandsPeople website

1939 Register (29 September 1939, maintained to 1952 & largely to 1991)

- A register taken to coordinate war efforts at home, to be used for: issuing identity cards, rationing, conscription, monitoring movement of people
- Includes civilian population of England & Wales, not Channel Islands, Isle of Man, Scotland, Northern Ireland plus members of armed forces on leave
- Updated with women's married names
- Shows complete date of birth. Records closed until 100 years from date of birth (or until production of death certificate to findmypast)

Scottish Valuation Rolls

- List owners & occupiers of properties, 1855 1930 (some to 1955)
- Include address, type of property (eg house, shop, mill), name of proprietor, name of occupier, occupation, yearly rent or rateable value of property)
- Feu duty (Scots for fee) was a remnant of feudalism in Scotland until 2000, paid to overlord or superior of land
