# English & Welsh births, marriages & deaths



## Civil Registration (government issued BMD certificates)

- Civil registration began 1 July 1837
- Organised into quarters: 3 months leading up to end March, June, September & December
- BMD events registered in a Registration District nearby but often not identical to place of birth
- Search index such as freebmd or General Register Office (GRO) and then order the certificate from GRO
- Birth certificates provide: date and place of birth, child's name, father's name, mother's name and maiden name, father's occupation, informant, registration details
- Marriage certificates provide: date and place of marriage, ages of both parties (or 'full age'), usual residence, fathers' names and occupations, witnesses, rites or details of marriage
- Death certificates provide: name and age of deceased, location and cause of death, informant's details

### Parish (church) records

- Parish records of baptisms, marriages & burials began 1538 & still continue (although not all survive)
- Copied annually to Bishop's Transcripts (BTs) so sometimes BTs survive when parish records do not
- Information included varies by time and place:
  - o baptisms name child, parents (or father only), sometimes gave father's occupation & residence, date of baptism, may or may not give date of birth
  - o marriages name both parties and parish of residence as well as giving date and place of marriage or banns
  - o burials name deceased and provide date of burial, usually age, may give occupation or father or spouse
- Marriage banns must be announced in church for 3 weeks prior to wedding until 1753 led to clandestine marriages
- From 1753 could marry by license, requiring a bond but no banns
- Roman Catholics had to marry in Anglican churches 1754-1837
- Free indexes available on (or via): FamilySearch, FreeReg, Dusty Docs, GENUKI
- Commercial websites: Ancestry, findmypast, MyHeritage, TheGenealogist
- Online Parish Clerks (OPC) are volunteers who transcribe & index all records for a given parish not available for all counties (try googling for 'OPC' & name of county)
- Parish chest records include eg Poor Law records, Settlement records, Bastardy bonds which may include BMD (see County Record Offices, National Archives, FamilySearch, Ancestry, findmypast)
- Settlement: an individual's right to receive poor law support & may provide details of birth or marriage or death

#### **Non-conformists**

- Members of protestant churches that do not conform to the established church (ie not Anglican)

  Some have their own registers (that may or may not survive) but these are **not** recorded in parish registers
- TheGenealogist holds many non-conformist records

#### **FreeBMD**

- Indexed & transcribed by volunteers indexes start from September quarter 1837 & are still being added to
- Mother's maiden name does not appear in births index until 1911, marriages linked to 'other party' from 1912, 'age at death' not included until 1866
- Marriage index: click on hyperlink in 'Page' column to show all names on page (both parties in all marriages)

#### **General Register Office (GRO)**

- Mother's maiden name added from earliest births index entries
- Age at death added from earliest deaths index entries
- Can only search +/- 2 years, and must specify 'male' or 'female' in each search
- Only births & deaths indexes currently available
- Better to search first in FreeBMD & then look up for more details in GRO
- Order civil registration certificates from GRO
- Can order certificates posted £11, PDF copy if available can be ordered to be emailed for £7

## FamilySearch (website of Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints)

- Can search for historical records by Location click on map & select to search English / Welsh records
- Can search the Catalog by Place to find eg 'Church Records' for a place
- Some images of historical records are available, others are transcriptions only
- Map of England Jurisdictions 1851 shows adjoining parishes & also start dates of parish registers & Bishop's Transcripts. Select Options allows searching historical records on FamilySearch for just that parish
- Use the Research Wiki (Search -> Research Wiki) to search for place or subject of interest, results provide links even into other websites
